#### Statement of Hazardous Nature

### **Emergency Overview**

Physical Description & Colour: Green gel.

**Odour:** No specific data - expected to be mild, characteristic odour.

Major Health Hazards: possible skin sensitiser.

#### **Potential Health Effects**

**Note:** sensitisation to ingredients such as d-limonene occurs in only a small percentage of persons, but those who are sensitised may show severe reactions. Most people may use this product in complete safety, however those sensitised to d-limonene should avoid contact with this product.

#### Inhalation

**Short Term Exposure:** Significant inhalation exposure is considered to be unlikely. Available data indicates that this product is not harmful. In addition product is unlikely to cause any discomfort or irritation.

**Long Term Exposure:** No data for health effects associated with long term inhalation.

#### **Skin Contact:**

**Short Term Exposure:** Classified as a potential sensitiser by skin contact. Exposure to a skin sensitiser, once sensitisation has occurred, may manifest itself as skin rash or inflammation, and in some individuals this reaction can be severe. In addition product may be mildly irritating, but is unlikely to cause anything more than mild discomfort which should disappear once contact ceases.

Long Term Exposure: No data for health effects associated with long term skin exposure.

### **Eye Contact:**

Short Term Exposure: Exposure via eyes is considered to be unlikely. This product is believed to be mildly

irritating, to eyes, but is unlikely to cause anything more than mild transient discomfort.

### Ingestion:

**Short Term Exposure:** Significant oral exposure is considered to be unlikely. However, this product is believed to be mildly irritating to mucous membranes but is unlikely to cause anything more than mild transient discomfort.

This is a commercial product whose exact ratio of components may vary slightly. Minor quantities of other non hazardous ingredients are also possible.

The TWA exposure value is the average airborne concentration of a particular substance when calculated over a normal 8 hour working day for a 5 day working week. The STEL (Short Term Exposure Limit) is an exposure value that should not be exceeded for more than 15 minutes and should not be repeated for more than 4 times per day. There should be at least 60 minutes between successive exposures at the STEL. The term "peak "is used when the TWA limit, because of the rapid action of the substance, should never be exceeded, even briefly.

# **Section 5 - Fire Fighting Measures**

#### **Section 6 - Accidental Release Measures**

**Accidental release:** In the event of a major spill, prevent spillage from entering drains or water courses. Wear full protective clothing including eye/face protection.
